# January 2019 – Coastal Restoration with Oil & Gas Research

New Orleans Geologist Chris McLendon, who works closely with Oil & Gas along the Louisiana Coast addressed the January 16 PABI Luncheon at the Belle Chasse Auditorium. McClendon who is past President of the N. O. Geological Survey and an exploration geologist with Upstream Exploration in Metairie, called upon the CPRA to open its doors to O & G Companies in order to use decades of data and maps compiled by the industry. He insist that information sharing will only improve the effectiveness of all parties. McLendon endorsed dredging over river diversions as the most effective way to redistribute sediment from the bottom of the Mississippi River. CPRA has maintained that dredged sediment is not as sustainable as land built via river diversions and is considering expanding the plan for the proposed Mid-Breton Sediment Diversion on Plaquemines' Eastbank from 35,000 cubic feet per second of water to 75,000 cfs.
